There are a number of agreements requiring courts and other judicial authorities in EU member states to give effect to judgments and orders issued by similar bodies in other EU countries. The European Arrest Warrant ("EAW") is the most popular of these "mutual recognition" measures. The operation of the EAW through the UK's Extradition Act has given rise to problems between British and French authorities in particular.

What will happen now that the UK has voted to leave the European Union? Is this a threat to EU/UK criminal co-operation post "Brexit" or is this an opportunity to reform the EAW to enhance its utility?
